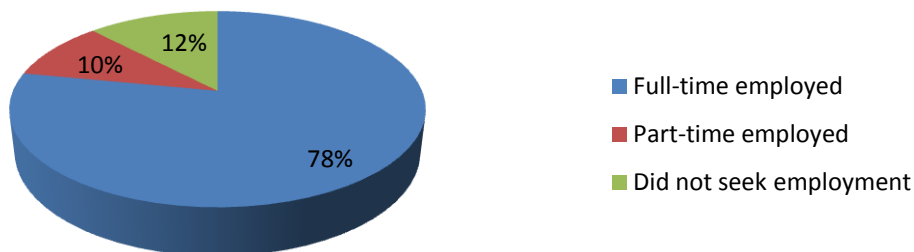


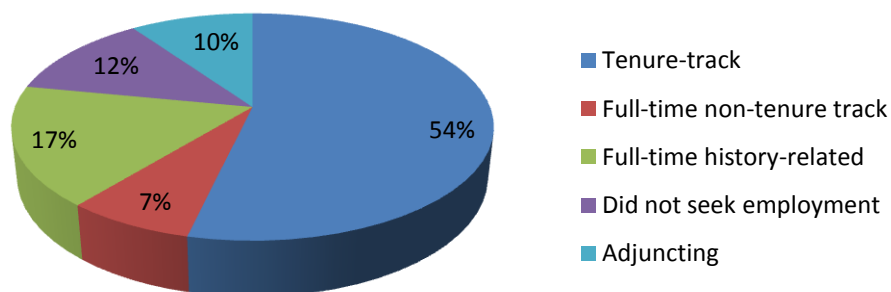
# TCU History Graduate Program, 2000-2010

## Overall Employment Among TCU History PhDs, 2000-2010



Since 2000, the History department has graduated 43 PhDs. Of the 41 for whom we have post-graduation information, 78 percent found full-time employment in post-secondary teaching or history-related fields, such as secondary school teaching, public history, or educational consulting. A small number of our graduates (12 percent) had already retired from their first career and chose not to seek degree-related employment beyond adjuncting. **If we exclude those who did not seek full-time employment, the percentage of full-time employed among our PhDs rises to 89 percent.**

Of those who found full-time teaching positions in two or four year colleges and universities, 54 percent are in tenure-track positions and 7 percent are in full-time non-tenure-track positions. 17 percent chose employment outside of teaching, but in fields related to their degree. **Again, excluding those who did not seek full-time employment raises the numbers to 61 percent in tenure-track positions, 8 percent in full-time non-tenure-track positions, and 19 percent in full-time history-related jobs.** The 10 percent who have not yet found a full-time position are either recent PhDs who are just entering the job market or those who for personal reasons have chosen not to look for jobs outside of the Metroplex.
